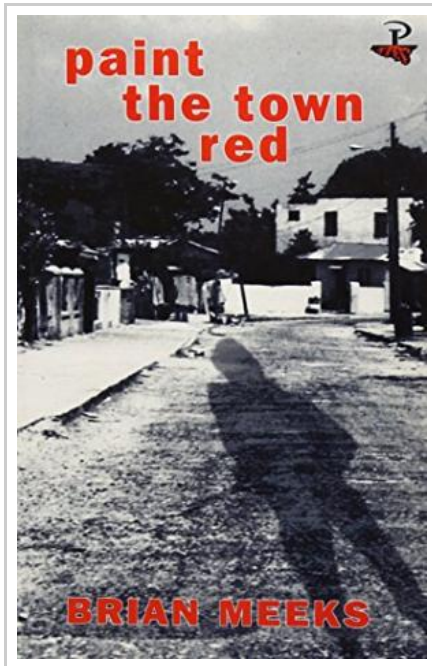




Paint the Town Red (Paperback)

In portraying the temptations towards tribal revenge that corrupted the vision of change, Meeks s novel speaks to the present, when even now, Jamaica s political divisions erupt in killings on the streets. As Mikey Johnson takes a minibus through Kingston on his release from eleven years in jail, what he sees and the persons he meets provoke memories of those years of virtual civil war when over eight hundred Jamaicans lost their lives. His encounters reveal that few have escaped unscathed from those years: there are the dead (in body and in spirit), the wounded, the turncoats, and those like himself who are condemned to carry the burden of those times. Mikey s particular quest is to discover why he survived when his friend, Carl, and his lover, Rosie, were killed...
